Christian Life and Worship/Formation/Integration/Prayer and Spirituality/ Young People:

Last week I was privileged to be on the Diocesan Pilgrimage to Lourdes. Our Diocese is under the patronage of Our Lady of Lourdes and to travel together as a diocese to Lourdes is always a wonderful experience and we hear stories of many vocations that have strong connections with it.

Led by Bishop Alan, the pilgrimage was attended by several priests, deacons, seminarians and parishioners from right across our rich and diverse diocese. Spending several days together with people we may not have previously known is a wonderful way for us to become a more integrated diocese. It is hard to fully express the real beauty of watching our young people assist and care for our assisted pilgrims and the joy that connection brings to both.

The beauty of the liturgies that we shared in was a great credit to everyone concerned but particularly our priests, deacons, seminarians and the musicians. It was a great joy to hear our very newly ordained Deacon (Rev Paschal Uche) and our very recently ordained Priest (Fr Gary Dench) preach and be reminded of the blessing that they represent. The prayers brought to Lourdes from so many of our parishes were offered by those of us who travelled to the shrine. Many prayers for vocations were offered at Lourdes and we continue them now that we are home.

I doubt very much that anyone who goes on this pilgrimage returns unchanged by the experience. As we prayed, talked and worshipped together, I was reminded of the close links between many of our Strands of Renewal. Each is important of itself but when combined and overlapped they become so much more together.

I would like to thank everyone involved and encourage anyone who has not been to consider it for the future.

Diaconate/Vocations/Leadership:

As the vision for the future of our diocese continues to evolve and develop, a number of parish partnerships have been considering how the role of the deacon might be part of the picture in the future. Ten parishes in the diocese have one or more active permanent deacons, and there are two men in formation for the permanent diaconate. Des Connors became a permanent deacon recently at Stansted.

By kind permission of Canon John McGrath, a study day on the permanent diaconate has been arranged at the Church of the Immaculate Conception, 11 Church Hill, Epping, CM16 4RA on Saturday 14th September 2019 from 9.30 to 1.00 (preceded by Mass in the church at 9.00).

The event is aimed at all those interested in finding out more about the permanent diaconate and the role it might play in the future of our diocese, and at anyone who may feel a sense of calling to this ancient yet very modern ministry in the Church.
